

Marriage License Information

Location:

The couple must appear together at the Sanpete County Clerk's Office at 160 North Main Street in Manti, Utah

Fees:

The current fee for a marriage license is \$50.00, which includes one certified copy of the marriage license upon return to the Clerk's Office. Additional certified copies of marriage licenses can be purchased for \$9.00 for the first, and \$5.00 for additional certified copies of the same license obtained at the same time.

Application Requirements:

A marriage license may be issued by the county clerk only after an application has been filed in the clerk's office, requiring the following information:

- The full names of the parties, including the maiden name of the female
- The Social Security numbers of the parties, unless the party has not been assigned a number
- The current address of each party
- The date and place of birth (state or country)
- The names of their respective parents, including the maiden name of the mother
- The birthplaces of father and mother (state or country)
- The race of applicants

Social Security Number Requirements:

- The Social Security numbers obtained under the authority of this section may not be recorded on the marriage license, and are not open to inspection as a part of the vital statistics files.
- The Department Health, Bureau of Vital Records, and Health Statistics shall upon request, supply those Social Security numbers to the Office of Recovery Services within the Department of Human Services.
- The Office of Recovery Services may not use any Social Security numbers obtained under the authority of this section for any reason other than the administration of child support services.

Legal Age:

Persons applying for a marriage license must be 18 years of age and have legal proof of age: Valid drivers license, or Birth Certificate, or Passport.

Marriage by minors:

If at the time of applying for a license the applicant is a minor (under 18 years of age), and not before married, the minor's father, mother, or guardian must personally give approval to the clerk. If the parents of the minor are divorced, consent shall be given by the parent having legal custody of the minor as evidenced by an oath of affirmation to the clerk. If joint custody has been awarded the parents, consent shall be given by the parent having physical custody of the minor the majority of the time as evidenced by an oath of affirmation to the clerk. If the minor is not in the custody of a parent, the legal guardian shall provide the consent and provide proof of guardianship by court order as well as an oath of affirmation.

If the applicant is 15 years of age, the minor and their parent or guardian shall obtain a written authorization to marry from a judge of the court exercising juvenile jurisdiction in the county where the either party to the marriage resides. The written authorization may also be obtained from a court commissioner as permitted by rule of the Judicial Council.
